METHODS

- introductory three-day • A palliative care for frontline health workers was developed. (162 HWs trained from 81 HCs in five districts)
- Half day palliative care administrators administrators from 6 hospitals/HC IV).
- Referral books for palliative distributed to the 4 hospitals and 2 health centres.
- Annual target tool developed to track referrals from trained health workers between July 2020 and July 2021.





- A notable increase in referral of patients following the training.
- collaboration Increased facilities through fixed clinic days set up at the 4 hospitals and 2 health centres.
